## **CHA Frameworks**

The process used may be an accepted national model; state-based model; a model from the public, private, or business sector; or other participatory process model (PHAB Measure 1.1.1 T/L).

## National models include:

- Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP)
  - O Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) is a community-driven strategic planning process for improving community health. Facilitated by public health leaders, this framework helps communities apply strategic thinking to prioritize public health issues and identify resources to address them. MAPP is not an agency-focused assessment process; rather, it is an interactive process that can improve the efficiency, effectiveness, and ultimately the performance of local public health systems.
